
Hepatitis B Vaccination: What You Need to Know


Hepatitis B is a vaccine-preventable liver infection caused by the Hepatitis B virus (HBV).

The common mode of HBV transmission is from mother to baby.

Without HBV vaccination at birth, newborns are

90% likely to develop a chronic HBV infection throughout their lives.

When to Vaccinate



3 Doses





For adults ages 18-59 that did not receive the vaccine as a baby...

2, 3, or 4 Doses

CDC recommends universal screening of adults ages 18 years and older for HBV and for those with no record of HBV screening or those without a chronic HBV diagnosis.
