



We strengthen domestic and global governmental public health through advocacy, capacity building, and social justice.


Our Mission and Vision

Hepatitis Appropriations Partnership

The Hepatitis Appropriations Partnership (HAP) is a national coalition that works with federal policy makers in Congress and the Executive branch and with public health officials to increase federal support and funding for hepatitis prevention, testing, education, research, surveillance, and treatment.



Hepatitis Testing Partnership

The Hepatitis Testing Partnership is a coalition of public health, providers, community based organizations, and academic partners working together to increase testing and linkage to care for hepatitis C. Some partners also support hepatitis B testing.

The Philadelphia Perinatal Hepatitis C Program: Using Data to Drive Innovation

TARGET POPULATION: Pregnant women living with hepatitis C (HCV); prenatal care providers, OB/GYNs, and pediatricians

LOCATION: Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

PROGRAM DESIGN: Data matching for patient identification and case management; patient and provider education

ESTIMATED COST: Programmatic costs are solely derived from PDPH staff time

FUNDING SOURCE: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Viral Hepatitis Surveillance Grant
