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COALITION BUILDING

 Hep Free NYC: Capacity building network to prevent, manage and treat viral hepatitis in NYC. Umbrella includes targeted coalitions

 NYC Hep B Coalition: Founded in 2009 by the NYC Health Department and community stakeholders; meets quarterly

 Advocacy Committee: Designed to advocate for local, state, or federal policy and legislative issues, with a priority on New York City focused policies

- 2. Share information with community members on advocacy and legislative issues
- 3. Provide information to the Hep Free NYC community regarding local, state and federal legislative issues










HEPATITIS B IN NYC, 2022









Neighborhood Poverty Level



Neighborhoods with the highest rates of people newly reported with chronic hepatitis B (per 100,000 people):


- Sunset Park East, Brooklyn (593.2)

- Dyker Heights, Brooklyn (255.1)
- Chinatown, Manhattan (232.4)
- Bensonhurst West, Brooklyn (179.8)
- Midtown-Midtown South, Manhattan (179.4)
- 9. Murray Hill, Queens (156.6)
- 10. Bensonhurst East, Brooklyn (156.5)
